Plus 3 extra days for support on delivering Intra-school competitions, curriculum, MTA training & young leader training. He supports our young leaders (Family captains) to lead Intra-school competitions each half term. - 30 G&T children attend sessions at St Luke's every half term. Children have met professional athletes, learnt about diet, mindfulness and active sessions designed to strengthen their bodies. - Offered and attend more competitions for those who are not in the partnership. i.e. Cross country at Killerton. - Twilight CPD training for teachers which our we attended Gymnastics as part of our staff meeting. - Teachers have access to St Luke's google drive which has lots of resources for planning. - Two spaces to attend their Primary 	£7,400
