There will be two separate sessions:



School Census Day is a key data collection point for all schools in England. It helps the Department for Education (DfE) gather important information about pupil numbers, attendance, and school meals. The data collected can influence future school funding and support services, so it's important that as many pupils as possible are in school and enjoying a school meal on this day.
