



February 2024 Parent/Carer Survey

Thank you to all the Parents/Carers who completed the recent survey. We had 117 responses; which is approximately 50 more than the last time we sent out a survey! We really value your feedback and will use it to inform our ongoing priorities.

Results

You can see the full results of the survey below. There are many positives to acknowledge, as well as some areas we will strive to do even better with in the future. Some of the changes we want to make, in response to your feedback, will take some time to embed. However, there are a couple of areas we believe we can address quickly.

1. In response to your feedback on question 5, we want you all to be more aware of what your children are learning about in all year groups. Therefore, at the start of each half-term, we will be emailing you a half-termly overview of what your children will be learning about that half-term. We will also be uploading these overviews to the school website. Furthermore, if there is something on the overview that your child is particularly interested in learning more about, you are always welcome to speak to the class teacher and they can give you more detailed information regarding specific things that they are going to be learning within a particular unit.
2. In response to your feedback on question 10, we want to highlight all the avenues you can access related to how your child/children are doing. Parents' evening is obviously a key time to find out how they are getting on academically and all teachers should be sharing this information with you during this time. However, if you would like to know this information at different points in the year, you are always welcome to speak to the class teacher about it. Information about how they are doing is also shared in our annual school report.

In addition, if your child is in Nursery or Reception, tapestry is our main way for communicating with you about how your child is doing. EYFS and KS1 parents' will also receive the latest phonics assessments for their child which will highlight any gaps in their understanding. Their Numbots account can also be used as a way of seeing how they are getting on with some of their core maths skills.

If your child is KS2, you are able to check how your child is doing in relation to reading by accessing their accelerated reader account. This will give you detailed information regarding the amount they are reading and how successful they are being in their reading quizzes. You are also able to track how they are doing in their times tables and spelling by taking an interest in their TTRS and spelling frame accounts.
