Ancient Greek Workshop - Year 5

After Early Bird Maths, we went to the hall to meet a visitor who was going to teach us more about ANCIENT GREECE. First we watched kids dress as Greek people from poor to rich. These included a slave, a farmer, a 5 year old kid, a rich lady & a soldier. Back in the day, democracy was a thing but strict.

If you were under 18, a slave, didn't own your land or were a woman then you

couldn't vote. The only person on that list of people that COULD vote was the soldier, unless the farmer was male and owned his land. (Fun fact, farmers had to pay to work!)

In the hall there were 5 different sections:

Section 1 was >CAREFULLY< looking at REAL LIFE battle equipment.

Section 2 you had to match the items to the labels (they were fake items) and strategically place them in a sack.

Section 3, there were pretend armour, shields and swords that you had to pair up, and then you could fight pretend with your friends.

Section 4 had a small wooden boat and a foam brick wall~the way this worked was 2 people sat on the boat, one front one back, and the others had to push the boat so that it pushed over the wall and everyone had to go on the boat once.

Section 5, a map of Ancient Greece with no labelled places on it and you needed to match the labels with City States on them with the place on the map where they are meant to go.

Then it was break time. 15 minutes later we continued. 5T stayed in class 5W as 5W moved to 5T's class where there were lots of outfits for different gods.

You had to go around the room guessing which outfit belonged to which god.

When everyone had guessed all the gods' outfits, one person from each group

went up to the front of the class dressed up in an outfit and the visitor revealed which god wore which outfit. They were going to take a group photo, but sadly the tablet didn't have enough battery. - :(- Then we had our lunch break.

Later on, we swapped again, & 5T went to do the outfit project. What changed was that 5W went to the hall instead of their classroom. In the hall they did some acting. There were about 5 bags with laminated sheets with a different play on it. The sheet had all the main and secondary roles and what happens in the play. There were also props in the bag. There were 5 groups of about 6 to 8 people. The plays were things like: Perseus & Medusa or The Flight Of Icarus. They only had about 10 minutes to get ready for performing to the rest of the class. There weren't any lines written down so they had to make up their own lines. It wasn't as easy as it sounds!

The activity was the Olympics and we split up into our family groups to take part in different sporting activities.

After every group had performed, 5T joined us in the hall to do an activity all together, both classes.
