Walkability

This week, children in Years 4 and 6 took part in the Walkability course. Walkability is a programme that helps children learn how to stay safe when walking near roads and crossing them. The sessions included practising the Green Cross Code, spotting and understanding road signs, and learning how to be alert when travelling around their local area. The aim is to give pupils the confidence to walk safely and independently, while encouraging them to enjoy active travel.

Year 6 Civic Award

Our Year 6's, who signed up to take part in the Civic Award this year, have made an excellent start. All the children have started their 'Citizenship in the School Community' aspect of the award with many of the children becoming reading buddies in school. Each class now has a Year 6 reading buddy visit them weekly to listen to some of our younger children read. This has been very popular with the Year 6's and the children who visit them!
