## Flo's Strange but True Animal Facts - The Aye-aye



The Aye aye (*Daubentonia madagascariensis*) is the world's largest nocturnal primate. It's only found in Madagascar, but looks like it belongs in a horror movie. It's a lemur with rodent-like teeth, large, disc shaped ears and an ULTRA thin middle finger, used for "percussive foraging" basically a fancy name for looking in tree bark for food, locating and extracting beetle larvae from trees.

Aye-aye's are endangered, due to habitat loss because of deforestation and active persecution driven by local superstitions.

### Habitat loss:

The rapid clearing of Madagascar's rainforests and deciduous forests for agriculture, logging, and human settlement has destroyed the high-canopy habitats that aye-ayes rely on for food and nesting

### Superstition and persecution:

In many parts of Madagascar, the aye-aye is considered an omen of bad luck or a "harbinger of death". Local legends often claim that if an aye-aye points its long, thin middle finger at someone, they are marked for death. Because of these beliefs, they are often killed on sight.

Sadly, Aye-aye's numbers are rapidly falling, luckily though, there are many groups of people who are trying to help Aye-aye's thrive like:

### **Madagascar Biodiversity Partnership, Lemur Conservation Network, Durrel Wildlife Conservation Trust, conservation Allies and Fanamby**

There are many more groups set out to fight Aye-aye's cause, but these are the main trusts you can look up. Now, it's time for Strange, Funny, Gross Facts!

### STRANGE, FUNNY, GROSS FACTS !

1. Did you know, Aye-aye's have a third eyelid which they use when gnawing through trees to protect their large, yellow eyes from woodchips, it's called **nictitating membrane!**
2. Aye-aye's also have an "electrocuted appearance" ,they are often described as looking like a "hairy mix between a raccoon and a rat," with long, coarse black hair that stands on end when they are excited. Just like when you rub your hair with a balloon!
3. My final **strange, funny, gross fact**, is that the Aye-aye's use angry screams ? When communicating, they use varied vocalizations, including loud screams for aggression, "tiss" sounds upon seeing humans, and "hai-hai" noises when fleeing. Exactly like toddlers, or my brother
